



# RESIDENCY in EQUINE INTERNAL MEDICINE

The Equine Department opens a new position for a resident in Equine Internal Medicine for the period **2024 to 2028**. This residency is a program which offers the opportunity to develop in–depth knowledge in internal medicine and related disciplines such as diagnostic imaging, anesthesiology, clinical pathology, pathology, according to the guidelines of the European College of Equine Internal Medicine (ECEIM).

# Number of opened positions = 1

### Prerequisites :

The applicant must be a graduate from a veterinary school, which is accredited by the ECEIM. The applicant must have an authorization to practice veterinary medicine in a European country and have at least followed an internship program over a 12 month period. Alternatively, the applicant must have acquired a similar experience over a minimal length of 24 months in medicine and surgery in a clinic which fulfills the criteria defined by the ECEIM guidelines. A good knowledge of French is recommended.

### **Description of the program:**

- The program lasts a minimum of 3 years (156 weeks) and can be extended up to 4 years to complete the requirements of the specialty college program. Each resident is supervised by a *Program Supervisor* and a *Resident Advisor*. The supervisor organizes and writes a specific program for the resident, which has to take into account the curriculum vitae of the applicant, the guidelines of the ECEIM, and the working organization of the CHEV (Teaching Veterinary Hospital, Lyon Veterinary School). At least 60 % of the total time (94 weeks) will be allocated to working in internal medicine under the direct supervision of an ECEIM and/or ACVIM Diplomates.
- The resident must also spend 2 weeks (80h) under the supervision of a specialist in anesthesia, 1 week under the supervision of a specialist in pathology, 2 weeks under the supervision of a specialist in clinical pathology, 4 weeks (120h) under the supervision of a specialist in diagnostic imaging and 2 weeks under the supervision of a specialist in critical care medicine. Two extra weeks can be spent pursuing the interest of the resident.
- The resident must take part in the emergency service of the Equine Clinic (*Clinequine*) with a 1 in 2 rotation (inclusive of bank holidays), and to the field ambulatory practice service.
- During the residency program, the resident must regularly take part in journal clubs and book readings, as well as practical and clinical teaching with the students.
- During the program, to fulfill the guidelines established by the ECEIM and to be allowed to sit the exams of the European College:
  - the resident must give at least 4 scientific presentations (1 national/international, 1 lay audience, 1 teaching seminar and 1 ECEIM journal-club)
  - the resident must attend at least 2 international conferences and at least one ECEIM summer school
  - the resident must write 1 paper as first author (clinical case, case series, short communication) in an international peer-reviewed journal and develop and complete a research protocol which will lead to a paper accepted for publication in an international peer-reviewed journal.

• An evaluation of the resident will take place twice a year.

### Beginning of the program: from January 2<sup>nd</sup> 2024 – until the position is filled

### Monthly allocation:

First year: 1204 €; Second year: 1264 €; Third year: 1324€.

#### Application process:

Application files must be sent by mail, with a letter of intent, a curriculum vitae, 2 reference letters (sent directly to the email address below) by the deadline of <u>15<sup>th</sup> October, 2023 (23:59)</u> Results will be available no later than October 24<sup>th</sup>, 2023.
